## **Pattern Introduction**

Give yourself or a friend a warm hug with this lovely capelet-style wrap.

Enjoy the quick work of crocheting with a big hook!

One size fits many and can be made smaller simply by using a different gauge yarn.

Make several in solids, variegated, or textured yarns. One for every outfit. ©

## **Big Hook Shoulder Hug**

## What you need

6 balls Gedifra Scarlet (50m/55yds. each) 330 yds total. OR other Super Bulky yarn.

Size M hook or size needed to get gauge.

Yarn Needle

## Stitches you need to know

Chain Slip Stitch Single Crochet Double Crochet

# Techniques you need to know Crochet in rounds.

## **Gauge** 8dc = 4"

\*It is important to get gauge on this garment. If you don't do a gauge swatch first, you run the risk of making it too small or too large.

#### Measurements

Unblocked, garment measures approx. 50-52" around at elbows. 13" from top to bottom edge.

## Abbreviations you need to know

Beg = beginning

Ch = chain

Sp = space

Do = double consists

## **Memory Refreshers**

- 1. "Fasten off" means to draw your yarn through the loop you have on your hook, then cut or break your yarn 3-4 inches away from loop. Now pull the yarn out of the securing loop you made. Give the end on your work a tug for good measure.
- 2. "Join yarn with sc" is an ingenious way to join your yarn to another section. Simply make a slip knot on your hook like you always do to begin. Insert your hook in the st or sp indicated and work a sc. You will pull the yarn through both loops on your hook (the second one being the slip knot). Works like a charm!
- 3. When you are told to work into the "ch-1 sp" (or ch-2 sp, etc.), you are simply placing your hook into the hole created by the ch-1. You do not actually try to put your hook into the chain itself…just under it altogether. This makes for very quick & easy crocheting.
- 4. When working in **rounds**, you do NOT turn your work after each round unless told to do so!

## **Special Stitches**

#### V-Stitch (V-st)

Work (dc, ch1, dc) in designated ch or sp.

#### **Picot Stitch**

Ch 3, sl st into first of these chains. Continue pattern as given.

## Walkthrough

#### Shawlette

\*\*The Shoulder Hug is crocheted in the round from the bottom edge up to the top picot edge. Then you will reattach the yarn at the bottom and work the decorative edge. That's it! Enjoy!

<sup>\*\*</sup>Work a gauge swatch using double crochet stitches.

## Begin:

Ch 100. \*Do not join for working in the rnd yet!

**Row 1:** Working into the spine of the chains, dc in 3<sup>rd</sup> ch from hook and in each ch across. Being careful not to twist, join for working in the rnd by slip stitching to top of beg dc (not into either of the first two chs). [98 dc sts, not including the ch-2]

**Rnds 2-6:** Ch 2, dc in same st as slip stitch, dc in each dc around. Join w/sl st to top of 1<sup>st</sup> dc, not into either of the first two chs. (\*\*End each rnd in this manner!)

**Rnd 7:** Ch 3, dc in same st as join, \*skip 2dc, V-st in next dc, rep from \* around. Join to 2<sup>nd</sup> ch of beg ch-3. [33 V-sts]

**Rnd 8:** Ch 2, dc in same st as join, dc in ch-1 sp (which is directly next to this last st), \*dc in between the next 2 dc, dc in next ch-1 sp, rep from \* around. Join. [66 dc sts, not including the ch-2. Decreased stitch count.]

Rnds 9-11: Ch 2, dc in same st as join, dc in each dc around. Join.

**Rnd 12:** Rep. Rnd 7. [22 V-sts.]

Rnd 13: Rep Rnd 8. [44 dc sts, not including the ch-2. Decreased stitch count.]

**Rnd 14:** Rep Rnd 9.

**Rnd 15:** Ch 1, sc in same st as join, sc in next dc, picot, \*sc in next 3 dc, picot, rep from \* around. Join with sl st to beg sc.

Fasten Off.

#### **Decorative Edge**

\*Before crocheting the edge, weave in the end using yarn needle to join the bottom edge together.

**Rnd 1:** With RS facing, join with sc (\*See Memory Refresher #2), \*ch 2, skip 1 dc, sc in next dc, rep from \* around. Join with a sl st to beg sc.

Rnd 2: Sc in next ch-2 sp, \*ch 1, dc in next ch-2 sp, picot, ch 1, dc in same ch-2 sp, ch-1, sc in next ch-2 sp; rep from \* around. Join with a sl st to beg sc. (Final pattern repeat may feel a bit cramped with the first one of the rnd. That is ok!)

Fasten Off.

Weave in ends.

Block if desired. (I did not block mine. Just put it on and wear it!)

### Variations on a Theme

\*To make this for a child or adult size XS, use Worsted Weight yarn with a Size H or I hook.

\*Child size...use DK weight yarn with a size G hook.

\*To add an extra bit of whimsy: crochet and affix a floral corsage pin.

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
